Dry Needling Liability & Consent Form

Dry Needling is a very successful medical treatment which uses thin needles (the same as in acupuncture) without any medication to achieve its aim. The goal is to relieve pain and improve range of motion, treat joint injuries and dysfunction while maintaining joint stability. Dry needling works by changing the area in which the body senses pain and by helping the body heal itself. This technique is based on concepts of modern medicine and is NOT acupuncture.
